

PHONICS

A – “awe” as the -a- in ball

E – “aye” as the ay in -ay- in day

H – “H” as the -h- in hall

I – “ee” as the -ee- in see

K – “g” as the g in great

N – “n” as the -n- in now

O – as the -OW- in snow

R – as the -r- in rat (its almost like a cross between an -l- and a -d- , this letter is pronounced a bit different in Mohawk)

S – “s” as the -s- in snake

T – “d” as the -d -in dog

EN – “uh” as -u- in fun (the n is not pronounced like English –EN- in Mohawk is a vowel)

ON – “oo” as the oo in spoon (The n is not pronounced like in English –ON- in Mohawk is a vowel)

TH – “T” as the -t- in tag

KH – “k” as the -K- in king

WH – F as the - f- Fun (this sound is a little bit different then an f in English but its almost the same)
